TERAMO AND ITS PROVINCE



With its unique and enviable geographical position, the city of Teramo is the ideal place to combine sports competition with a pleasant period of entertainment and various types of amusement. Located in central Italy, the town is equidistant from the Adriatic Sea, with fifty kilometres of coastline and sandy beaches of fine golden sand and the highest peaks of the Apennines, the mountain range of Gran Sasso, included in the largest natural park in central Italy, with impressive snow-capped peaks and a wild and unspoiled nature.

Among the artistic testimonies of the Roman and medieval past present in the city, the Teramo territory combines, especially during the tournament period, a significant beach and tourist season, thanks to the wealth of accommodation facilities and attractions, particularly for young athletes: sun, sea, water facilities, nightclubs, and musical and entertainment events.

In Teramo, gastronomic culture also plays a leading role in welcoming and hospitality, with a variety of venues and restaurants offering the most genuine and representative dishes of a rich and ancient tradition. Its central location, just over 150 kilometres from Rome, makes Teramo the ideal base for excursions and easy access to Italy's most fascinating destinations and art cities, among the most beautiful and famous in the world, such as Florence, Venice, and the Capital itself.

The sports and cultural association "Interamnia World Cup", in synergy with the specially constituted Institutional Committee, with the technical collaboration of the Italian Handball Federation, under the auspices of the Italian National Olympic Committee and the International Handball Federation, convenes and organises the "53rd Interamnia World Cup international handball tournament."

WHEN

The tournament will take place from July 9 to July 15, 2026, in Teramo. (Participants' arrival July 8/departure July 16)

PARTICIPANTS

Participation is reserved for youth teams - male and female - of clubs regularly affiliated in the current season with national federations adhering to the International Handball Federation and representative provincial, regional, and national teams that are direct expressions of national federations adhering to the International Handball Federation.

Participation of school youth teams whose national Organisation is affiliated with the International School Sport Federation is also allowed.

GRAND PRIX INTERAMNIA UNITE CATEGORIES

The tournament was born in 2017 as part of a collaboration between the Interamnia World Cup and the University of Teramo. In the sixth edition of the event, university teams composed of athletes already enrolled at the University or about to enrol can participate.

OPEN CATEGORIES

In this category, teams will be included that have age conditions not specifically assimilable to any category, which have athletes of all ages starting from 16 years old. (The tournament development is subject to the participation of at least 4 teams.)

GENERAL RULES

The rules of the Italian Handball Federation and the International Handball Federation will be observed. The tournament matches will start on July 9 at 8:30 AM and will end on July 15 at 8:00 PM. The procedure includes an elimination phase, a semifinal, and a final. Each team will play a minimum of 5 and a maximum of 9 matches.

ELIMINATION PHASE

The races will take place in Teramo on the morning of the 9th and in the morning and afternoon of the 10th, 11th, and 12th of July.

SEMIFINAL PHASE

The races will take place in the morning and afternoon of July 14 in Teramo.

FINAL PHASE

The races will take place in the morning and afternoon of July 15 in Teramo.

IMPORTANT ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Each participant must show an identification document (passport or identity card) that must be shown at each tournament match. The detailed and final program of the event will be announced later to the registered teams.

The Interamnia World Cup reserves the right to communicate any changes to the format and to reject, by May 20, 2026, entries if a minimum of 5 teams per category is not reached. New registrations will also be declined if they are received after the lodging capacities have been exceeded.

FRIENDLY MATCHES AND TOURNAMENTS

During the stay in Teramo or in the other indicated locations, all teams will have the opportunity to play friendly matches.

The Organisation is also available to complete the schedule for foreign teams who wish to arrive earlier or extend their stay in Europe to participate in handball tournaments before or after the "53rd Interamnia World Cup".

REFEREES

The matches of the tournament will be officiated by Italian referees appointed by the Refereeing Sector of the Italian Handball Federation and by specially invited foreign referees.

PREMIUM

The first-placed teams (in each category) will be awarded a cup and a trophy. All teams ranked second, third, and fourth will receive a trophy. Other awards will also be given to teams, athletes, and managers who have distinguished themselves.

"QUI TERAMO, ITALY" is the slogan that aims to succinctly describe the festive, colourful, and suggestive context of the grand inaugural parade of the Interamnia World Cup, which is already so rich and cosmopolitan. The traditional parade will take place at night, on Thursday, July 9, winding through the historic centre of Teramo to merge, like in a magical cocktail, the athletes participating in the handball tournament, Italian and foreign musical groups, historical, folkloric, and theatrical performances of various kinds. The beauty and "magic" of the initiative lies precisely in the combination where young people are the protagonists of a marvellous and unforgettable party. Those dressed in typical, traditional costumes from their own country or city, those in representative uniforms or with original and extravagant clothing, the young people from every corner of the globe characterise their presence, offering a unique spectacle of their personal creativity. The event brings together in an ideal embrace the city of Teramo and the numerous guests from all over the world, some of whom are affected by tensions, from which a testimony of peace and friendship among peoples wants to emerge.

REFEREES 2026 VS TRAINERS (July 14)

Participants in the tournament but not players, handball experts but not active athletes: it will be the referees present at the 2026 edition of the Cup to "challenge" the coaches who field their teams. Competition and fun are guaranteed, and the tournament proves to be a unique moment of meeting and confrontation of the different entities revolving within the world of handball.

TOURIST EXCURSION STONES AND PEOPLES 2026 (July 13)

As part of an interesting project entitled "The mountain as the centre of the world," the Organising Committee, in collaboration with the Explora International Association, proposes an initiative that has always been successfully carried out in past years, "Rocks and Peoples 2026."

We therefore invite the participating clubs to bring a small stone from their territory to Teramo, which will be placed on the highest peak of Gran Sasso d'Italia among the stones of symbolic mountains of the world, as a symbolic union of the people of the Earth.

In order to further enrich the traditional Grand Inaugural Parade with ethnic and folkloric contents and to further stimulate the participation of the participating teams in its various aspects, the organisers have launched the "Most Characteristic Costume" Contest.

All participants are therefore invited to unleash their creative spirit and characterise their participation by wearing costumes related to their nation or their city, or by highlighting the most peculiar aspects of our sports event, which is fundamentally inspired by the themes of brotherhood and friendship among people.

An ad hoc Judging Commission will identify the most deserving group to whom a free stay will be offered as a prize during the 54th Interamnia World Cup (up to a maximum of 15 people)

Participation of at least 10 groups is required for the competition.

EXCURSIONS IN TERAMO AND AMONG THE BEAUTIES OF ITALY

During the tournament, thanks to the particularly favourable geographical position of the city of Teramo, it is possible to reach the seaside resorts and the water amusement park in just over half an hour using public transport.

As part of the "Stones and Peoples 2026" initiative, an excursion will be organised in the mountains, in the heart of the Gran Sasso-Laga National Park, on the highest peaks of the Apennines, managed by the event organisation.

For those who would like to take advantage of their stay in Italy and visit the art cities of Rome, Florence, or Venice, the day after the tournament ends, it will be possible to take a trip at advantageous costs. Interested clubs can request detailed information from the Organising Secretariat.









CURIOSITIES AND



Technical-sporting aspects:

The Interamnia World Cup is also one of the longest-running international tournaments that, over the years, has played a leading role in promoting sports and handball in particular, attracting international attention to the point of being defined by the International Handball Federation (IHF) in 2002 as "the most important youth handball tournament in the world." Founded in 1973, the event takes place continuously during the first half of July and, in 51 years of activity, has established itself as one of the main events on a global level, offering youth teams the opportunity to start competing on an international stage and providing major teams with the chance for appropriate athletic preparation for the main championships.

- The Interamnia Cup has the merit of managing to host year after year - (with an average of 42 nations per year in the last 23 years) in a single location, Teramo, a total of 9,274 teams from 117 nations, which represent more than 54% of all countries in the world and more than 75% of all nations where handball is practiced;
- •The Coppa Interamnia has the merit of always favouring the quality of the participants (over quantity), counting, since 1983:
- •Technicians, managers, and athletes of national Under 21 teams from 54 countries, representing the 5 continents, for a total of 264 teams, 148 male and 116 female (including the male world champion teams of the Soviet Union and Egypt and the female teams of the Soviet Union, Romania, Denmark, and Russia);

Technicians, managers, and athletes of youth teams from the most prestigious clubs in Europe (including 14 winners of European Cups for senior teams, representing 9 nations, and 132 who have taken part in European Cups for senior teams, representing 31 nations);

• Illustrious personalities of the world handball (executives and coaches / former internationally renowned athletes), journalists (from newspapers and major broadcasters), and photojournalists;









CURIOSITIES AND



- The Interamnia Cup has provided a valuable contribution, moreover:
- •To the growth of the refereeing class by hosting, up to now, 3,228 referees from 78 nations, from 4 continents;
- •To the technical evolution of sports-underdeveloped nations which, through the Interamnia World Cup, have been able to make their first appearance on the international stage (some examples include: Afghanistan, Albania, Andorra, Armenia, Bangladesh, Cameroon, Colombia, Congo, Costa Rica, Gabon, Ghana, Djibouti, Greenland, Guinea, Hong Kong, Honduras, India, Ireland, Kenya, Lebanon, Libya, Liechtenstein, Malta, Mongolia, Mozambique, Nepal, Nigeria, New Caledonia, Palestine, Panama, Peru, Rep. Dominican Republic, Réunion, Tibet, Uruguay, Zimbabwe, Yemen.

The Interamnia Cup also has the merit of having fostered the birth of many other tournaments worldwide and of increasing the spread of handball internationally, thus also strengthening its image and credibility.

- 458 entertainment groups, totalling 2,132 artists, have enriched the sports event with its recreational and cultural aspects.
