PART 1: DAILY BUSINESS

1. Welcome & Review

The EHF Beach Handball Commission (BC) chairwoman Gabriella Horváth welcomed the members of the newly elected EHF Beach Handball Commission to the first working meeting of the electoral period. She underlined the very successful events in the season 2020/2021 and expressed her wish to continue with this positive and collaborative spirit for the last event of the year, the Champions Cup in Sicily, as well as for the next season.

1.1. Minutes BC Meeting 04/2021

The minutes of the last meeting in April 2021 were approved without any comments.

1.2. EXEC Meeting 04/2021

Horváth informed on the EXEC meeting in April, notes are available.

1.3. TD Meeting

During the TD meeting (26 August), each commission presented the reports regarding summer events and projects and a preview/activity plan for 2021/2022. For beach handball, the outcome of the last BH EURO was great in terms of TV exposure and general organisation level. The main goal for BH is to target a more professional attitude by all the stakeholders, and the partnership with Infront and DAZN (I&D) will be helpful. The anti-doping agreement with IHF was signed and the tests are confirmed for the upcoming events.

2. Online Testing & eLearning

2.1. Status update - Last Test

The second testing phase in 2021 ended on 2 June 2021. The test was performed on the platform ILIAS. The exam accessibility and the feedback from officials were good. The rule questions needs to be checked and updated, and it will be done before the next testing period by Opava and the EHF Office.

The number of active delegates is 59 and the number of active referees is 81; the next planned testing period is scheduled for 11 - 24 October (re-test: 28 October - 9 November). The BC talked about the possibility to offer a tool for test training for the BH officials, verifications will follow in this regard with the IT department.

2.2. Teaching material online

The eLearning section was implemented on the platform ILIAS. All relevant regulations and other teaching materials (teaching videos, event analysis and publications) are online. Easy and intuitive access to the platform for the officials and the beach handball community are very important.

3. European Beach Handball Tour (ebt)

3.1. ebt season - Status tournaments and teams

For the ebt season 2020/21, 46 tournaments and 202 teams (90 female and 112 male teams) were registered. Out of the 46 registered tournaments 9 tournaments were cancelled due to Covid-19 restrictions: the pandemic especially limited the first part of the season. The creation of tournaments in new countries, such as Latvia was emphasised. At each tournament female and male teams were attending and almost all of the tournaments presented young categories and mini beach handball activities.

For the upcoming season, the responsible person will be Nancy Johnson; ebt regulations are to be updated by end of October 2021. The BC will forward a motion to adapt the following change of regulation:

Art. 2.20 "Each head delegate must send an obligatory written report with details and photos as a proof of the tournament criteria (e.g. organiser points) within **three (3) days** after the end of the tournament."

During the season 2020/21, this obligation was not always observed on time. With the next season, an official warning will be issued in case of violation. At the second violation, the delegate will be suspended from the EHF Officials list.



3.2. ebt Finals 2021

The organisation of the last ebt Finals in Torrox, Malaga (ESP) was very positive. Last-minute problems were solved in cooperation with the OC and EHF; the Hygiene Protocol worked properly. The event experienced great success on the streaming platform Twitch for the first time.

3.3. ebt Finals 2022 – bid process

The bid for the ebt Finals 2022 was released in August and the deadline for the application is 10 September 2021; the EXEC will award the organisation right at the next meeting (24.09.).

3.4. ebt future concept

A proper approach for the development of the system should be to promote an online forum to discuss, with the involved stakeholders and experts, the possible future scenario for the ebt and the club competitions in Europe.

In connection with the registration and licensing project for beach handball, ebt teams and tournaments also need to be in close cooperation with National Federations in the future. The NFs will be involved in the confirmation process for teams and tournaments. All teams need to define their players' lists in due time before the respective tournament.

3.5. National Team Week BH 2022

The proposal for the National Team Week Beach Handball 2022 is 27 June - 3 July; the dates were confirmed by all BC members.

4. Beach Handball EURO

4.1. Overview and Recap

Marek Góralczyk presented an overview and gave a brief recap about the YAC & Senior BH EUROs 2021 in Varna, Bulgaria. Very well-organized event, the OC was eager to fulfil all the requirements on time. The infrastructure and the branding were very good and offered an excellent picture of the event. It was the most successful beach handball event in terms of global coverage TV broadcasting; a detailed report will follow. For the future, the main court needs to be bigger in terms of stands capacity (number of spectator) and the promotion of the event is something to improved and structured.

The regular online meetings OC/EHF Office/BC/I&D proved beneficial and should be incorporated for the upcoming events. The right time frame would be monthly meetings over the last 6 months preceding the competition, and weekly during the last month. The task distribution and the timeline for EHF Officials and Staff should be prepared more in advance in order for all nominated persons to know properly their tasks and be ready to fulfil their duties in the best possible way. More working places for media in a dedicated container/tent



at the court area need to be settled. For future events, the final delegation list should be presented one week before the start of the competition to facilitate the preparatory work carried out by the accreditation and media matters. The BC members agreed to enlarge the final list to 14 players (12 will be present at the event and 2 as home substitutes) and 6 officials. At the Technical Meeting, the teams need to select the 12 players, and during the competition, they can make maximum two (2) changes. A motion to the EXEC will be forwarded.

4.2. EHF Officials Reports

Most of the officials provide general positive feedback about all the organisational aspects of EUROs 2021. The problems highlighted were related to local transportation, as the transfer hotel/venue need to be always on time, and the provided Hummel equipment, as the package should be enlarged and present clothing more specific for beach handball.

4.3. Qualitative Analysis

The qualitative analysis of the BH EUROs 2021 was conducted by Alex Gehrer and will be published online.

4.4. YAC 16 Beach Handball EUROs 2022 - Bid Process

The bid was released in August and the deadline for the application is settled for 10 September 2021. The next EXEC in September will award the organisation right.

4.5. Beach Handball EURO 2023 - Bid Process

The organisation right for the Senior EURO 2023 is to be announced in March 2022 and the event will be awarded by EXEC in June 2022; According to the suggestion from BC, the Senior event will take place 25-28 May 2023 (confirmation by I&D is necessary). The new bid document will be developed with the involvement of the media department and I&D to define the standard required in terms of marketing, media and TV matters.

The YAC17 EURO 2023 will be 29 June - 2 July 2023. The format of the event will be open and the all the National Federations can register.

4.6. Media Matters

Jelena Bagaric and Andrew Barringer presented the Beach Handball EURO 2021 debrief regarding media matters and TV productions, prepared with the support of colleagues in the media department, as well as I&D feedback from the event. They underlined the excellent results in terms of media and social media activities and TV productions. For the future, the bid process needs to start earlier to offer more time for the preparation and also the sale of media rights.



It is important to set a standard for the TV production and the camera plan for harmonizing the quality of the events, as well as the court plan to have the same level and set up on all four courts.

The super-slow motion and the crane offered great content. The number of cameras on all courts is to be increased, because most of the broadcasters cannot send a one-camera match. Moreover, lighting for night matches is really important, at least on two (2) courts and the minimum standard needs to be fixed to ensure the quality of the production. The goal line technology TV replay was appreciated. The position of the photographers on the courts needs to be set and fixed during the match. The awarding ceremony needs to be revised in the format and shortened. Given the density of the overall schedule, it may be worth extending the event duration by an extra day.

The BC and the Media Department agreed on the creation of a working group for the development of a "EURO Media Guide" for the future BH EUROs. The working group will be composed by EHF Office (Jelena Bagaric, Tobia Pisani and Nancy Johnson), BC members (Marek Góralczyk, Marco Trespidi and Mario Bernardes) and support from I&D. The draft of the media guide will be produced by the end of the year.

5. EHF Champions Cup (ChC) 2021

5.1. Status Update - Site Visit

The site visit was held on 23/24 August 2021 at Isola delle Femmine, Palermo; the minutes are available. The overall impression is very good: the selected hotel for the EHF officials and the teams has a very good standard and the event area is prominent. The OC is working hard to fulfil all the requirements and the organisation charter was already provided. The deadline for the team's registration is set for 10 September 2021. The officials' nomination was completed at the end of July - eight delegates and 16 referees will be at the event. The Covid-19 protocol will be adapted and developed in cooperation with the local organiser to ensure the maximum level of safety for the participating teams considering the pandemic situation and the conditions in Italy and all over Europe.

5.2. New Bid

The new bid for the following years of the Champions Cup will be released in September 2021. The following EXEC in November will award the organisation right.

6. EHF Education course 2022

6.1. Bid and registration process

The EHF BH Education courses in 2020 and 2021 were cancelled due to the pandemic; the new bid for the education courses in 2022 will be released in October 2021. Opava expressed the lack of female officials and countries involved in terms of numbers reflected in the



officials' list; improving these areas are the main goals for the future. The idea is to promote two courses for next season, alongside ebt tournaments, giving priority to female officials and growing countries. The BC confirmed the intention to ask for support from the Women's Handball Board.

7. European Olympic Games (EOG) 2023

The organiser expressed the preferred frame for the beach handball event: 20-26 June 2023. The overall event period is from 20 June to 2 July 2023; coordination with the local organiser will follow in the coming months.

7.1. Status update

The EHF is responsible for the management and the technical coordination of the events, the furnishing of the materials (goals, line system and balls), the nomination of the officials and the creation of the playing schedule. The playing system is already agreed in the signed contract, with 8 + 8 teams, three days of competition on two courts, 12 referees and four delegates nominated by the EHF.

7.2. Qualification concept

The BC agreed on the qualification concept: EURO 2023 will be the qualification tournament and the first 7 teams per gender will qualify for the EOG 2023. A motion to the EXEC will be forwarded.

8. **EUSA Games 2022**

8.1. Status update

Trespidi stated that the event is confirmed for the period 17-30 July 2022 in Lodz, Poland. The next workshop is planned for the end of September where more information is expected; again, the EHF is required to supply the materials, manage the technical aspects of the event and nominate the officials. The European University Sports Association has nominated Jelena Eric (SRB) to serve as EUSA Technical Delegate for Beach Handball for the next four-year term, based on a proposal from EHF.

9. Publications

9.1. Beach Handball Book Project

The beach handball book project in cooperation with the Sport University of Cologne is ongoing and the publishing date is scheduled prior to the EHF Anniversary in November; the book will be promoted and distributed during the event.

9.2. Education Materials – Future Development

The detailed plan regarding the education materials and the connected projects will come in the masterplan section of the meeting.

The BC members support the development of a stronger communication with IHF and the creation of a global beach handball calendar for the upcoming years. Moreover, the BC supports the change of the calendar for the World Championship in 2027 with the aim to be present at the Olympic Games 2028.

10.2. World Championships U18 and Senior

The events are still in the bid process and the IHF reported three candidates; the confirmation of the dates and venues will follow.

10.3. Motion Players Uniform

Detailed revisions and suggested modifications of men's and women's uniforms were discussed to be submitted to, and approved by, the EHF Executive Committee for presenting the motion to the International Handball Federation for the Council meeting on 20 September.

The EHF Beach Handball Commission has outlined new proposals regarding regulations of players' uniforms as follows: reformed uniform regulations for both the men's and women's players' kits, in the spirit of equal treatment of genders and meeting modern requirements. It would allow certain flexibility for the teams to find a comfortable individual and creative solution. In other words, it would offer a free choice within the given measures of the illustrated drawings. It must be underlined that it is important to standardise the format of



the uniforms in the regulations and to stipulate that an entire team must wear identical uniforms.

11. Miscellaneous

11.1. Registration and Licensing System Beach Handball

The EHF motion to the IHF Council "Player Eligibility & Transfer for Beach Handball Players" was unanimously approved in principle. The BC nominated Mario Bernardes as the responsible person for the project with Nancy Johnson as the main reference in the office. A common working session IHF/EHF at the transfer department level is necessary and will be scheduled in the near future clarifying some wording details. The next steps and the timeframe for the involvement of the National Federations need to be defined in the next months.

11.2. Hummel Equipment for BH Officials

The Hummel equipment for BH referees and delegates was distributed during the season. For the next season, the selected material should be more suitable for beach handball in terms of style, and the package should be enlarged to ensure the comfort and good appearance of the officials during the events. (increasing the number of items and adding a towel and a tracksuit). The BC asked for direct involvement in the selection of the materials.

11.3. Activity Plan and Budget 2022

The budget for the current season will be verified in October 2021 and the budget for 2022 will be developed accordingly.

11.4. Beach Handball Lecturers List

The BC members voted for the following list of beach handball lecturers that will be presented to the EXEC for approval. The lecturers were selected with specific tasks based on individual competencies. Lecturers proposals for 2021-2023:
