#### Minutes:

# 1. Welcome / Agenda / Basics

J. Eliasz welcomes the participants to the 2<sup>nd</sup> MC meeting 2019.

# 2. MC Minutes and other minutes (MC related topics)

The MC notes are approved without any comments.

J. Eliasz reports on the EHF EXEC Meeting dated 04/05 April 2019 in Copenhagen / DEN. The MC motions: prolongation of cooperation with European Week of Sports, the organisation of a 2020 European Wheelchair Handball Championships as well as the SMART programme with UKR were confirmed.

The motion regarding the signing of a "memorandum of understanding" with Special Olympics Europe Eurasia needs further preparation prior to a final confirmation by the EXEC (see agenda point 5.5.).

B. Kozlowska shortly reports on the Secretaries General Conference dated 03/04 April in Copenhagen / DEN. Beside other topic presentations were held on "grassroot, Women's Handball, etc." followed by discussions in small groups (divided by the EHF Nations ranking). The presentations on grassroot were well accepted by the National Federations showing strong interest in further activities (see agenda point 5.6.). In addition all participants had the chance to take part in a "5-aside" match (a Danish invention in direction of life long handball).

### 3. Methods & Coaching

3.1. Analyses 2019 - W17 EURO in SLO, W19 EURO in HUN, W17 Championship in GEO, W17 Championship in ITA, W19 Championship in LTU, W19 Championship in BUL - preview All organizers were requested to nominate an expert for the quantitative analysis. Feedback was only received from GEO and ITA.

W17 Championship GEO: George Gvazava W17 Championship ITA: Sergio Palazzi

The remaining organizers will be contacted again. In case no feedback is received the EHF proposes the following experts:

W17 EURO SLO (01 – 11 August 2019): Marta Bon / EHF MC member W19 EURO HUN (11 – 21 July 2019): Peter Kovacs / EHF MC member W19 Championship BUL (13 –21 July 2019): Martin Tuma / EHF Lecturer - CZE W19 Championship LTU (15 – 21 July 2019): Murat Bilge / EHF Lecturer - TUR

- YAC Injury Analysis 2019: The teams participating in the 2019 YAC EUROs were informed on the procedure for the injury analysis. The participation in the injury analysis is obligatory for all teams. Marina Gillard will prepare the injury analysis based on the material collected and summarized by the EHF Office.

# 3.2. Analyses 2020 - EHF EURO AUT, NOR, SWE

- All Star Team: The EHF MC recommends involving the responsible person for the qualitative analysis in the process of the All Star Team selection. Therefore the following procedure is proposed: One MC and CC member (out of the EHF EURO Officials) as well as the responsible person for the qualitative analysis, one EHF Media representative + 1 EHF Office member for administrative issues shall define the All-Star-Team. The detailed procedure will be discussed with the responsible persons of the Competitions Commission.
- Cooperation with Swiss Timing / Quantitative + Trends: In case of Swiss Timing being the EHF EURO statistic partner, they shall be involved in analyzing trends of the EHF EURO. M. Bon will provide a detailed concept on the content of future analysies.

### 4. Education and Training

### 4.1. RINCK Convention-Signatories/Non-Signatories status

The annual reports are still missing from BIH, ISR, LAT, LUX, NED and NOR. Another reminder will be sent to the respective Signatories by the EHF Office. In addition Pedro Sequeira will contact the signatories concerned directly. A list of contact persons responsible for each of the Signatory Countries should be available on the EHF website to enable an easier communication in this matter.

#### 4.2. National Master Coach Courses

DEN: 11 EHF Master Coach and Pro-licence holders were confirmed by the EHF MC.

FRA: 41 EHF Master Coach and Pro-licence holders were confirmed by the EHF MC.

ISR: A reminder for participants' thesis and CVs shall be sent by the EHF MC.

ISL: The  $1^{st}$  module of the National Master Coach Course was organized on the weekend 02 - 03 March 2019. 24 participants attended the course. The  $2^{nd}$  module took place from 13 - 14 April 2019. The next module is planned for June 2019.

NED will organise their first National Master Coach Course in cooperation with BEL. The first module will take place 31 May - 02 June 2019. The organizer planned 11 short modules in 2019/2020, 2 days-long each. The programme of the course was provided.

ROU will organize the National Master Coach Course in 2019/2020. The time schedule is planned as follows:

- 1<sup>st</sup> module: 12 - 16 June 2019

- 2<sup>nd</sup> module: 19 - 25 August 2019

- 3<sup>rd</sup> module: 16 - 22 December 2019

- 4<sup>th</sup> module: 20 - 22 January 2020

The programme of the course was provided.

POR plans to organise 2 modules of the National Master Coach course in June (including the elearning).

RUS is interested in organizing a National Master Coach Course and requested further details on the procedures. RUS has been informed accordingly.

# 4.3. EHF RINCK Convention Task Force

The meeting of the Task Force Group will be organized on 11 - 12 May 2019 at the Sofitel Hotel in Budapest/HUN on the occasion of the Women's Final 4. All invited experts confirmed their participation. The agenda of the meeting was distributed. The outcome of the meeting will be communicated to the MC and EXEC accordingly.

4.4. 2020 EHF EUROs coaches' licensing – pro-license mandatory for one team official on the bench

Based on the EHF EXEC decision in 09/2018 (initial decision 01/2016) each team is obligated to have one team official who has a valid EHF pro-license on the bench each match (already part of the EHF EURO regulations).

# 4.5. 2020 EHF Master Coach Course – preview (content, method)

The 1<sup>st</sup> module of the EHF Master Coach Course will take place on the occasion of the Men's EURO 2020 in Vienna/AUT. The proposed date is 16 - 23 January 2020 (Main Round). The Austrian Handball Federation confirmed their support for the organization of the course. More details regarding the accommodation, costs, etc. will follow. The content / methods will be defined after the EHF RINCK Convention Task Force Meeting in May.

### 5. Youth, School, and Non-competitive sports

#### 5.1. Goalcha

The first session of the GOALCHA Street Handball online education will be organized in September 2019, as a part of the EU Week of Sport (EWOS) and as introduction to the grassroots topics which will be presented during the 5<sup>th</sup> EHF Scientific Conference (21 - 22 November 2019) in Cologne/GER.

Furthermore the MC discusses the possibility of organizing another "Goalcha Day" in 2020 to encourage all Member Federations to organize Goalcha activities in their own countries.

### 5.2. Young Coaches Workshops - preview

The Young Coaches Workshop will be organized in the period 10 – 14 June 2019 in Siófok / HUN. The course venue will be Siófok KC Sport Centre hall. The hotel "Kiss Szilard Sport Hotel" will be at the same venue in walking distance. The demonstration teams will consist of the local club "SKC Handball Siófok". The invitation letter (for 7 male and 7 female coaches not older than 33 years) will be sent early May.

### 5.3. EU Week of Sport (EWOS)

The European Week of Sport will take place from 23 - 30 September 2019 with the EHF as a sporting partner as in the previous years. The same concept like in the last years will apply for this edition as well. Chris O'Reilly will coordinate this activity for the EHF on Social Media.

# 5.4. Wheelchair Handball

- 2019 EHF Working Group "Wheelchair Handball": The working group will be held on 27 April 2019 / AUT. Participants:

The working group will define necessary adaptations of the classification system as well as for the rules resulting out of the 2018 European Wheelchair Handball Nations' tournament and the implementation of the classification system.

- 2019 European Wheelchair Handball Nations' Tournament preview: The calling for participants was sent on 20 March 2019 to all Member Federations. Despite some communication with interested National Federations, no application was received. The respective National Federations will be contacted again. In case no application is received by end of May, the EHF MC will cancel the organization of the 2019 European Wheelchair Handball Nations' tournament and concentrate on promoting a possible European Wheelchair Handball Championship in 2020.
- 2020 European Wheelchair Handball Championship preview: The motion for hosting a first 2020 European Wheelchair Handball Championship was confirmed by the EHF EXEC under the precondition that the number of participating teams has to exceed 4. The official calling will be made in May 2019. The awarding shall be realized by the EHF EXEC in their meeting in June (or September) 2019.

Furthermore a detailed concept regarding the education of future EHF Wheelchair Handball Referees and Delegates will be presented to the EXEC in their next meeting in June 2019.

### 5.5. Special Handball Activities

The motion for signing a "Memorandum of Understanding" with Special Olympics Europe Eurasia Region was postponed due to missing information. After further contacts an adapted version as well as further information will be provided at the next EXEC meeting in September 2019.

#### 5.6. EHF Grassroot Strategy

The grassroot related presentations were well received by the participants of the Conference of Secretaries General (04 - 05 April 2019) in Copenhagen/DEN. Several National Federations announced that they will implement grassroot activities already this year.

A general EHF Grassroot strategy needs to be defined and communicated to the National Federations. A respective document will be prepared and presented at the next MC meeting dated 29 August 2019.

B. Kozłowska will participate in the UEFA Grassroots Conference (10 - 14 June 2019 in Minsk/BLR).

# 6. Development

### 6.1. SMART programme

The SMART programme with UKR was confirmed by the EHF EXEC in their last meeting April 2019.

Basically all current SMART programmes are supported following the respective contract.

AUT: The granted material has not been requested yet. A reminder will be sent.

EST: The granted support was not requested yet. A reminder will be sent.

MNE: The report was finally provided. The material will be sent accordingly.

NED: The granted material was ordered in April 2019.

SCO: The final report on phase 2 is still missing. A reminder will be sent.

### New requests:

BEL: Further details were provided by BEL. The EHF MC therefore requests the EHF EXEC to confirm the SMART programme with BEL (see "motions to EXEC").

MON (Levant programme): The granted budget was adapted to earlier made agreements between MON and the EHF EXEC. Unfortunately – despite various requests – no further information was provided by MON.

SRB: A request for a new SMART programme was received by SRB. The content was adapted to the usual SMART guidelines. The EHF MC therefore requests the EHF EXEC to confirm the SMART programme with SRB (see "motions to EXEC").

# 6.2. Short term support

POR: Support with 22 Quick Play goals, 250 balls

GEO: Support with 6 iGoals and 60 Goalcha balls

CYP: Support Beach Handball material 1 TV line-system, 40 balls

LAT: Support Beach Handball material 3 TV line-systems, 100 balls, 6 iGoals

CZE: Support Beach Handball material

ITA: Support with 2 pairs of indoor goals and catch nets (2019 EHF YAC 17 Ch)

#### 6.3. Other requests

"Best female coach of the season 2018/19": M. Bon informs on the new awarding of the "Best female coach of the season 2018/19" and the request of the Womens' Handball Board for input in form of criteria. Due to a lack of information the EHF MC is currently not able to provide any input until further information is provided.

# 7. EHF Scientific Conference 2019 – concept/committee announcement

The 5<sup>th</sup> EHF Scientific Conference will be organised on 21 - 22 November 2019 in Cologne/GER in cooperation with the German Sport University Cologne.

The 1<sup>st</sup> announcement was published on 16 April 2019. The conference topic is: *Handball for Life*. Several workshops, subject diversified for different target groups will be organized:

- grassroots topics
- coaching-related topics
- medical treatment, injury prevention, rehabilitation, nutrition, mental treatment- relating to indoor and beach handball

The participation fee amounts € 100,- and includes the participation in the conference as well as a print copy of the articles provided. The deadline for registration to the conference is 08 September 2019.

Each EHF Technical Commission will nominate one representative who will take part in the event. Juan Carlos Zapardiel / EHF BC, Carmen Manchado / EHF CC and M. Bon / EHF MC will support the Preparatory Organizing Committee with the abstracts' approval process.

### 8. TD/CAN Report

H. Höritsch reports on the meeting of the Technical Delegation: A presentation was held by Lars Erichsen / EHF IT Office member on the ILIAS e-learning tool used in EHF. Current projects: National EHF EURO Qualifiers, Club Management Seminar, Delegates learning and testing platform). A referee teaching tool will be provided prior to the summer events. The new officiating structure will be valid as of July 2019. H. Höritsch also reported on the IHF Working Group on Rules.

### 9. "Handball 4 Dual Career" and "ONSIDE" Erasmus+ Projects

H. Höritsch informs on the "Handball 4 Dual Career" and "Onside" Erasmus+ Projects. The final conference on "Handball 4 Dual Career" will be held on 12 June in ESP. The EHF will be represented by EHF Scientific Network members Carlos Prieto, Bojana Jelicic , Stefan Walzel and EHF CAN Coordinator Helmut Höritsch.

The EHF partner German Sport University Cologne submitted already a dual career follow-up project on academic cross border education for top athletes.

From the Erasmus+ "ONSIDE" project the EHF has taken result bulletins (Europe-wide desk research on officials' recruitment and education from other sport federations) available for the TRC.
