Minutes:

1. Welcome / Agenda / Basics

Jerzy Eliaz welcomes the participants to the 1st MC meeting 2020 and informs that Klaus Feldmann is no longer a member of the Methods Commission. However, he will continue as EHF Lecturer.

Vincent Schweiger is introduced as new EHF Office staff member. He will be responsible for the Club Manager Seminar in Cologne / GER. Furthermore he will assist in the administration of the Master Coaches, etc.

Furthermore Eliaz points out that the MC has to provide inputs and work out activities in connection with the EHF Masterplan 2020 – 2027 (Player / EHF Grassroot Growth

2. MC Minutes and other minutes (MC related topics)

The MC notes are approved without any comments.

In addition J. Eliaz shortly informs on the latest EXEC meetings: The 2020 European Wheelchair Handball Championship was awarded to Sweden. The motion for establishing the profiles “EHF Wheelchair Handball Referees” and “EHF Wheelchair Handball Delegates” were confirmed. For details see point 5.4.

3. Methods & Coaching

3.1. Analyses 2020 – EHF EURO AUT, NOR, SWE

The analysis of the 2020 EHF Men’s EURO will be provided by Peter Kovacs and the quantitative analysis by Swiss Timing. Both documents will be published online via activities.eurohandball.com. Marta Bon proposes to include video references in the analysis in the future.

- All Star Team
P. Kovacs informs on the selection of the All-Star-team during the EHF EURO AUT, NOR, SWE. 5-6 players were selected for each position during the main round and new players for the final matches. The system worked well and is planned to be implemented during the EURO competitions in the future.
- STS, Kinexon, Digital Score Sheet
Successful usage during the 2020 EHF EURO AUT, NOR and SWE of live and team data acquisition despite some technological problems in the beginning. A follow-up meeting EHF – SwissTiming (STS) – Kinexon was held on 26 February. A decision has to be taken by the EHF leadership regarding the usage of the raw data.

As a result of the meeting between Martin Hausleitner and Carmen Manchado concerning the scientific follow-up, the results of the Kinexon EURO project will be elaborated on scientifically by Carmen Manchado/EHF CC, Marta Bon/EHF MC and Petra Platen/University Bochum.

3.2. Analyses 2020 – M20 EHF EURO in AUT/ITA (03 – 12 July 2020), M18 EHF EURO in SLO (13-23 August 2020), M20 EHF Championship in BIH / LAT (4-12 July 2020), M18 EHF Championship in BUL / MNE / MKD (17 – 23 August 2020)

- Preview:

A letter was sent to the organizers requesting the nomination of National experts who will be responsible for realizing the qualitative analysis by 01 April 2020.

SLO has already nominated Mr. Jani Klemencic for the M18 EHF EURO.

- YAC Injury Analysis 2020

The teams participating in the 2020 YAC EUROs will be informed on the procedure for the injury analysis. The participation in the injury analysis is obligatory for all teams. Marina Gillard will prepare the injury analysis based on the material collected and summarized by the EHF Office.

- Code of conduct for YAC events

A code of conduct for coaches will be created by the EHF legal department. Furthermore, an additional education for team doctors, physiotherapists, etc. is foreseen to be arranged on the occasion of the YAC events.

The obligation of insurance for all players will be added to the regulations.

4. Education and Training

4.1. International Sport Seminar “Why Does European Sport Need Skilled and Competent Coaches?”
Doru Simion informs on the International Sport Seminar “Why Does European Sport Need Skilled and Competent Coaches?” in Zagreb / CRO dated 27 - 28 February 2020.

One of the main topic was related to grassroot and the motivation of children. D. Simion presented the EHF RINCK Convention and the academic certification by Las Palmas University to the participants.

Pedro Sequeira outlines the importance to attend such seminars from EHF side.

4.2. RINCK Convention- Signatories/ Non-Signatories status / CYP case / RUS case

D. Simion reports on the current status regarding the annual report –the reports of EST, FRA, LAT, and LTU are missing. A further reminder will be sent.

CYP: 3 CYP coaches were denied to attend the 2nd module in GRE, although they did participate in the 1st module. D. Simion will send a letter to GRE underlining the mutual recognition of EHF requirements. According to the EHF coaches concerned shall receive permission to participate in the course, since their Level 3 status was confirmed by their National Federation following the EHF RINCK Convention guidelines.

RUS/ Roman Abramenko: The EHF will withdraw Roman Abramenko’s approval as a Master Coach due to the lack of the required qualification for taking part in the Master Coach education. According to the National Federation Mr. Abramenko was confirmed on level 2. His participation will be recognized as a Level 3 diploma according to the EHF RINCK Convention.

4.3. National Master Coach Courses

In 2019 National Master Coach Courses ended in GER, SRB, ISL, ESP, ROU, ISR, POR, SLO, CZE/SVK with a result of approximately 270 new Master Coaches.

The EHF received all necessary documents, therefore provided the certificates.

ISR - 5 graduates submitted their theses within the planned time frame; The others receive an expansion of their submission/presentation date of the theses to April 2020 within the 2 year timeframe the Exec set in 2014.

Currently there are National Master Coach Courses in progress in SWE, GRE, RUS, ESP, HUN, BLR, NED

SWE is holding 2 modules of the National Master Coach Course in 2020

- 2nd Module 09-15.01.2020
- 3rd Module 22-28.06.2020

GRE is holding their 2 remaining modules of the National Master Coach Course in 2020

- 3rd Module 01-05.07.2020
- 4th Module 19-23.08.2020

RUS started their first National Master Coach Course with 38 participants from 19 - 28 December 2019 in Moscow. The EHF received detailed reports about the course. The second module will take place 16-25 June 2020.

ESP is organising a National Master Coach Course in 2020

- 1st Module 02.01 - 06.01.2020
- 2nd Module 22.06 - 27.06.2020
- 3rd Module 13.08 - 18.08.2020

HUN started the National Master Coach Course in September 2019 with 18 participants. The course will end in June 2020 with the presentations of the theses.

BLR is currently holding their first National Master Coach Course starting 16 - 22 December 2019 with 27 participants. The remaining modules will take place:

- 3rd Module 15.06 - 22.06.2020

NED will finish their National Master Coach Course in 2020. The remaining 6 modules of their course will be carried out on the following dates (each 2,5 days)

DEN is starting a National Master Coach Course in June 2020

POL is planning a National Master Coach Course starting in December 2020

POR is planning a National Master Coach Course having the first module 15-21 June 2020

There are PRO License Renewal Courses planned in ROU(2/3 June), POL (12-14 June), CZE (30/31 May), DEN (12-14 June), POR (19-21 June)

4.4. EHF RINCK Convention Task Force / EHF RINCK Convention Panel

Peter Kovacs and Beata Kozłowska inform on the meeting of the EHF RINCK Convention Task Force held in Vienna / AUT on 27 February 2020. Due to various reasons only J. Eliaz, P. Kovacs and Marco Sibila / EHF Lecturer – SLO attended the meeting. Concerning the PRO License Renewal Courses details will be defined due to the different needs regarding the course content. The PRO Licence shall be valid for three seasons. New ways of PRO Licence prolongation have been defined (e.g. Analysis writing) Furthermore, details regarding National Master Coach Courses (format, date, venue, etc.) are foreseen to be published via the EHF website in order to give coaches the possibility to attend those courses. The minutes of the meeting will be provided within the next week.

The MC proposes that the EHF RINCK Convention Panel consists of the members of the RINCK Convention Task Force (Ulrik Jörgensen / DEN, Paul Landure / FRA, Michael Neuhaus / GER, Zoltan Marczinka / HUN, Marco Sibila / SLO, Jerzy Eliaz / EHF MC, Peter Kovacs / EHF MC) and Wolfgang Pollany / AUT, Lidija Bojic-Cacic / CRO, Michal Barda / CZE, Bent Dahl / NOR, Rolf Brack / GER, Alexandru Acinte / ROU, Milan

Petronijevic / SRB, Murat Bilge / TUR, Marta Bon / EHF MC, Marina Gillard / EHF MC, Carmen Manchado / EHF CC and Marco Trespidi / EHF BC. The members will be contacted accordingly. The final approval is with the EHF EXEC (see motion to the EXEC).

The RC Panel is responsible for recommendations regarding necessary steps for the 40 RINCK Convention signatories and non-signatories on coaching education matters and structures by mainly working as an advisory/counselling group of experts in direct contact with the signatories/non-signatories.

4.5. 2020 EHF EUROS coaches' licensing; 2020/21 EHF Champions League - mandatory pro-license
6 Teams (BIH, BLR, DEN, RUS, SRB, UKR) of the 2020 EHF Men's EURO participants did not register any coach with the required Master Coach PRO Licence. According to the decision taken by the EHF EXEC on 21 November 2019, the mentioned National Federations are obliged to provide a confirmation regarding the respective coaching level of their coaches until the end of June 2020. In case the documents will not be submitted on time, legal cases will be initiated.

4.6. 2020 EHF Master Coach Course – review

The 1st Module took place in Maxx Steigenberger Hotel in Vienna, Austria in the period 16 - 23 January 2020.

35 coaches (7 female and 28 male coaches out of 14 Member Federations: AUT, CRO, CZE, EST, GBR, GER, HUN, IRL, ITA, LAT, MKD, NED, SLO, SRB) participated in the course. Additionally 5 coaches from the Austrian Handball Federation prolonged their EHF PRO Licence.

For the first time the EHF Master Coach Course has been organised based on a new curriculum defined by the EHF RINCK Convention Task Force. The coaches attended and analysed all matches of the 2020 Men's EHF EURO played in this period of time in Vienna.

The detailed report has been prepared and provided to the EHF Exec.

The 2nd Module will be organised from 15 - 21 June 2020 in Győr / HUN. The date of the 3rd Module needs to be confirmed with the LOC but is planned for 10 - 16 December 2020 in Herning / DEN.

P. Kovacs prepared a proposal of the of the 2nd and 3rd Module programme. The final version of the documents for the second module will be confirmed and sent to the participants until the end of March 2020.

5. Youth, School, and Non-competitive sports

5.1. Goalcha / iCoachKids / Playfinity – further cooperation

The webinar took place on two consecutive days in October (16/17). The complete programme of the webinar was available on both days in order to enable the participants to freely arrange their schedule. Overall there were 43 participants from 21 countries. The webinar covered the topics GOALCHA Philosophy, methodological and didactic principles of GOALCHA and how to implement GOALCHA Street Handball in the school and clubs.

GOALCHA and the Academy4Coach ensured a perfect rundown and therefore provided a superb lecture.

Lasse Boesen (Goalcha representative) provided a proposal of the Goalcha- EHF cooperation in the future. He proposed a regular delivery of a certain amount of Goalcha balls for a lower price and a new system to pay 1€ more for each ordered ball in order to invest the collected money for lecturers' education. The balls can be produced without Select logo, not to interfere in any sponsor contracts of National Federations/ clubs. Details of a possible agreement shall be ready in April 2020.

J.Eliasz signs the Memorandum of Understanding with iCoachKids.

Further talks will be initiated with Playfinity.

5.2. Young Coaches Workshops – preview

The Young Coaches Workshop will be held in Siofok / HUN in the period 09 – 14 June 2020.

The MC discussed the programme shortly and recommends the following coaching team: Peter Kovacs / EHF MC member, Milan Petronijevic / EHF Lecturer – SRB, Jürgen Boss / EHF Scientific Network member (Mental Coach) – GER, Carlos Prieto Martos / EHF Scientific Network member (former Handball player) – ESP and Stefan Zierhofer / BSPA – AUT (Sport Scientist). The lecturers will be informed accordingly.

The invitation letter to the National Federations shall be sent in April 2020 at the latest.

5.3. EU Week of Sport (EWOS)

A detailed report regarding EHF related activities within the EU Week of Sport (23 - 30 September 2019) was produced by Chris O'Reilly. For the first time 20 EHF Member Federations participated by various activities. In general the week was promoted in 42 European nations with 29.000 events giving a total 15.5 million people the opportunity to be involved in a variety of physical activities and sports, including handball. For details please see the respective report.

The EHF MC is in favour of a prolongation of the EHF/EU partnership regarding the EWOS in 2020. The same concept like in the previous years will apply for this edition as well. The MC therefore requests the EXEC to confirm the prolongation. (see motion to the EXEC).

5.4. Wheelchair Handball

- IHF Working Group on "Wheelchair Handball"

The first meeting of the IHF Working Group on "Wheelchair Handball" was held in Basel / SUI on 26 October 2019. The EHF was represented by J. Eliaz / EHF MC Chairman and N. Rabenseifner / EHF Office.

The working group agreed on using the EHF rules for EHF tournaments, the classification manual and the regulations for IHF Wheelchair Handball tournaments. However, this needs to be officially confirmed by the IHF Council.

Furthermore the participants were informed on the necessary steps to add Wheelchair Handball to the Paralympic Programme: Organization of minimum 2 World Championships, National championships in minimum 24 countries on 3 continents. For details please see the respective minutes.

- 2019 European Wheelchair Handball Nations' Tournament – review

J. Eliaz informs on the 2019 European Wheelchair Handball Nations' Tournament in Zagreb / CRO dated 14/15 December 2019. For the first time 6 teams participated in the tournament (CRO, HUN, NED, ROU, SLO, POR). The new classification system was used and very well realized by the IWBF (International Wheelchair Basketball Federation) classifiers present. The cooperation with the organizer was excellent.

Special goals were produced by the organizer in the required measurements (3 x 1,7m) which gave a new value to the sport.

No complaints by the teams were received during the tournament. However, after the tournament a letter was received by the Hungarian Handball Federation regarding accessibility of the hall and hotel rooms. Therefore side visits shall be foreseen for all future EHF Wheelchair Handball events.

- 2020 European Wheelchair Handball Championship – preview

The Championship (18 – 23 November 2020) was awarded to the Swedish Handball Federation by the EHF EXEC. The playing hall will be Kristianstad arena. The accommodation is foreseen in Valjeviken (4-5 teams, already used in the Wheelchair Handball Nations' tournament in 2016, all rooms adapted – rehab centre, appr. 33km distance (30min drive) to hall, training hall available) and First Hotel Christian IV in Kristianstad (1-3 teams and EHF Officials, 1km distance to hall, training in Kristianstad arena).

Furthermore the International Handball Federation has stated its interest in hosting a World & European Wheelchair Handball Championship with the common aim to promote and develop wheelchair handball. A first IHF-EHF workshop was held in Vienna / AUT on 05 February 2020. The Championship shall host a maximum of 12 teams (and max. 8 European teams) and will be realized following the rules, regulations and classifications used for EHF events (which were also adapted by the IHF Working Group on "Wheelchair Handball"). The costs for additional teams and officials as well as a financial contribution to the organizer shall be paid by the IHF.

The final decision on the realization of a common Championship following the frame defined in the workshop depends on the official IHF and EHF decision.

- EHF Wheelchair Handball Referees and EHF Wheelchair Handball Delegates
The motion for installing the role of “EHF Wheelchair Handball Referees” and “EHF Wheelchair Handball Delegates” was confirmed by the EXEC. The calling to the National Federations was sent on 31 January 2020. The candidates need to have a National status as referees or delegates and will have to pass a theoretical test via e-learning which will be repeated every 2nd year. Furthermore the delegates will be observed during an EHF event in order to receive the EHF status. The deadline for announcing the candidates is 31 March 2020.
- Classification manual
The MC discusses a proposal by Kees van Breukelen / IWBF Classifier for adding intermediate classes (1.5, 2.5, 3.5, 4.5). The intermediate classes shall be used in case a player does not clearly belong to one main class (1, 2, 3, 4). A technical solution for counting the max. team points shall be found before adding the intermediate classes in future events.

5.5. Special Handball Activities

The motion for signing a memorandum of understanding with Special Olympics Europe and Eurasia (SOEE) was accepted by the EXEC in their meeting in November 2019 and signed in February 2020.

The cooperation was published via the EHF media. Further content (knowledge exchange in conferences, demonstration matches, etc.) shall only be realized upon request and with a dedicated budget.

5.6. EHF Grassroot Growth (EHF Master Plan) / 2020 Activities

The EHF MC Members will provide new ideas regarding Grassroots, based on the EHF Master Plan Player/Pillar EHF Grassroot Growth. P. Sequeira and B. Kozłowska will prepare a detailed action plan for grassroot activities in 2020 based on the received input and original concept presented by B. Kozłowska in the last meeting.

6. Development

6.1. SMART programme

AND: The report on the latest SMART programme was received. In the meantime a request for continuing the SMART programme was received. The EHF MC supports the requests and asks the EHF EXEC for their approval (see motion to EXEC).

ARM: The SMART programme was realized according to the contract. The reports were received accordingly. A request for continuing the SMART programme was received. The EHF MC supports the requests and asks the EHF EXEC for their approval (see motion to EXEC).

AUT: The material for phase 2 was sent. The interim report for phase 3 was received.

BEL: The interim report on phase 1 was received. The invoices for the financial support will be sent at the end of phase 1.

EHLB: The contract with EHLB was only finalized shortly due to open questions. The signing will be realized in due time.

EHPU: The interim report on phase 3 is expected end of February. The final financial support will be transferred afterwards.

ENG: Running according to schedule. The interim report for phase 3 will be sent by end of March 2020.

EST: Running according to schedule. The interim report for phase 1 will be sent by end of February 2020.

FIN: The interim report on phase 1 was received.

LAT: The defined support for phase 3 was already provided. A reminder for the interim report was sent. Furthermore LAT already stated their interest in continuing the SMART programme. A request for continuing the SMART programme was received. The EHF MC supports the requests and asks the EHF EXEC for their approval (see motion to EXEC).

LUX: Running according to schedule. The interim report on phase 1 is expected end of February 2020.

MNE: Running according to schedule. The final report on phase 2 is expected end of March 2020.

MON: Running according to schedule. The interim report on phase 1 was received.

SCO: Running according to schedule. The interim report on phase 3 was received. A request for continuing the SMART programme was received. The EHF MC supports the requests and asks the EHF EXEC for their approval (see motion to EXEC).

UKR: Running according to schedule. The final report on phase 1 is expected for end of June 2020.

6.2. Short term support

Beside the nomination of EHF Lecturers (see point 10.) Beach Handball material was sent to ESP and Handball material to GRE.

A letter shall be sent to all National Federations informing them that the short term programme can also be used to request support for the development of wheelchair handball.

6.3. Coaching Mentoring programme

A new Coaching Mentoring Programme was signed with MNE.

7. EHF Scientific Conference 2019 / Sports science/medical centre LUX

J. Elias reports on the conference that took place from 21 - 22 November 2019 in Cologne/GER and has been organised together with the German Sport University Cologne. 111 participants attended the event. 7 keynotes and 47 oral presentations and 12 posters have been presented. Numerous positive feedbacks were provided by the participants and speakers. The "book of abstracts" was published online prior to the conference. All presentations were made available for the participants. A full-scale documentation of articles will be sent to all participants and EHF commissions in print (also available as e-book on the EHF website). The presentations have been streamed live on the EHF CAN Facebook and EHF CAN YouTube channel. Furthermore, EHF media made several interviews during the event.

For the first time, the practical presentations in the sport hall have been organised. The participants could watch and join themselves Goalcha, Playfinity and Qatch activities.

The detailed report about the conference has been prepared and provided.

After further discussions between Lior Laver and Michael Wiederer a decision on a possible partnership between the EHF and the sport science / medical centre in LUX based on the EHF Master Plan will be made by summer 2020.

8. TD/CAN Report / IHF Rule Working Group – Report

J. Elias reports on the meeting of the Technical Delegation: The invitation to the 2020 EHF Club / Federation Manager Seminar in Cologne / GER dated 28 – 30 May 2020 was sent on 25 February 2020. The registration deadline ends on 10 April 2020.

The IHF Rule Working Group was attended by Dragan Nachevski / EHF MC and H. Höritsch / EHF Office. Some possible rule changes will be tested during events before a final decision is made.

Five EHF Master Coaches from five different countries – Finland, Iceland, Italy, Slovenia and Netherlands – gained the academic title "Master of Science / EHF Master Coach" by defending their academic master thesis in front of an EHF and Las Palmas University academic panel. In total 25 graduates from 15 different European countries have achieved their academic certification and degree over the past three years.

9. "Respect your Talent" campaign / 2020 EHF Women's Handball Network Workshop

The "Respect your Talent" campaign will be continued during the YAC events in 2020. Alenka Cuderman is the head of the project and will coordinate the realization for the male YAC events in 2020.

The 2020 EHF Women's Handball Network Workshop will be held in Vienna / AUT on 10 / 11 March 2020. The MC topics development and Grassroots will be presented by N. Rabenseifner (development) and B. Kozłowska (Grassroots).

11. EHF MC Master Plan 2020/ Activity Plan & Budget 2020


The MC focus in 2020 will be on RINCK Convention / Coaching education, development programmes, Grassroots and Wheelchair Handball (for details see respective agenda points).
